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- * Aesthetic medicine
- * Cosmetic surgery
- * Aesthetic laser therapy
- * Regenerative medicine

Recommended creams after treatments: INFINI, CO2.

- Cosmetic vaseline - it does not absorb through the skin or mucous membrane, remains on the skin and leaves a protective layer. Dosage: unlimited.
- Alantan ointment - greasy ointment. Used for poorly healing wounds. Dosage: 2-3 times a day.
- Zinalfat - soothing - regenerating cream, regenerates the epidermis, protects and cares for irritated skin with symptoms of local inflammatory changes. Soothes and helps prevent micro-injuries, abrasions, and skin irritation. Dosage: 2 times a day.
- Cutibaza - semi-greasy, odorless cream recommended for dry and very sensitive skin. Recommended for allergic skin. Dosage: 2 times a day.
- Avene Cicalfate - antibacterial regenerating cream, acts as a natural protective plaster. Creates a protective layer on the wound. Dosage: 2 times a day.
- La Roche Posay-Cicaplast - soothing moisturizing preparation, reduces itching and tightening sensation, accelerates the rebuilding of the skin's protective barrier. Dosage: 3 or more times a day.
- Natural Active Cream - a product used directly after the procedure. Reduces burning sensation, redness, and dryness of the skin. Dosage: unlimited.

Preparations for skin after laser treatments: SOS.

- Scaldex - antibiotic-based ointment, works on thermal burns, chemical burns, poorly healing wounds, small inflammatory lesions in the form of nodules and pustules. Ideal for people prone to scarring.
- Flamezil - a hydrocolloid gel for treating small dry or moist wounds. Doubles the healing period.

After the procedure, the patient applies sunscreen cream three times a day, minimum SPF 30.
